TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the Town will vote to raise, appropriate and set apart the amount of money necessary to secure State aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed January session, 1905.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same, and determine in what manner the same shall be expended.

5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the extermination of moths and beetles.

6. To choose two persons for three years for Trustees of Cemeteries.

7. To choose one person for three years for Trustee of the Public Library.

8. To choose one person for three years as Trustee of the Trust Funds of the town.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise in addition to the amount required by law, for the Public Library.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries for the ensuing year.

12. To see if the town will vote to have one or more liquor agents for the ensuing year.

13. To choose a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

14. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on 1918 taxes paid before Sept. 1, 1918.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

These funds are left in trust to the Town of Pelham, the income of which is to be applied to the perpetual care of the lots named, and by virtue of the State law the Town shall pay $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent interest annually on Trust Funds held by the Town.

A report of the Library Trustees seems largely a matter of form, as the main portion of information is contained in the Treasurer's and Librarian's report. The use of the library, both as for entertainment and also as a source of reference for our scholars, seems on the increase, and we are proud of the fact that few towns of our size and means have one that can compare with it. The consecutive service of our Librarian and her thorough acquaintance with the books, also of the tastes of those taking them, combined with the thoughtful attention to their demands, whether presented in person or sent by messenger, adds much to the library's usefulness.

The coat of paint applied to the outside of the building renders its appearance a more creditable one to the centre of the community, and it is expected that the other outside repairs may be done the coming season.

It is to be regretted that the preservation of the ceiling in the Memorial Room demanded the removal of the flag pole on the building, and it is to be hoped that our citizens will not permit the town to remain without one to take its place in these troublesome times, when the humblest hamlets in the land take pride in displaying Old Glory as a token of their loyalty and patriotism.

As a further suggestion, it would seem that as so many of the town's brave sons are engaging in our country's defence, a service flag with a star for each, whether enlisted in the town's quota or elsewhere, be displayed either on the walls of the Memorial room or in the win-

dow, with a list of their names in some conspicuous place.

As the labor of caring for the lawn is purely voluntary, it was deemed no more than right that a lawn mower be owned by the library, accordingly a machine was purchased this year.

Lists of desirable books and any suggestions that may add to the efficiency of the work will be gratefully received by the Trustees.

EXPLANATION

To the voters of Pelham School District: Your School Board would say that the omission of the usual itemized report of schools is due to the amendment to the Public Statutes by the last General Court as follows: "The fiscal year of town and special school districts beginning February 16, 1917, shall end August 31, 1918, and thereafter the fiscal and the scholastic year shall end August 31, annually."

In accordance with the above and under instructions of the Department of Public Instruction we publish only the warrant and estimates for the ensuing fiscal year, the itemized report will appear in the Town Report of 1919. This will of necessity be for four terms, after which the reports will be for three terms annually as heretofore. Any information desired will be furnished by the Board, on request at the school meeting.

Articles 14 and 16 with estimates are inserted at the suggestion of the Department of Public Instruction.

To the inhabitants of the Town School District of the Town of Pelham, qualified to vote in District affairs: You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on Saturday, the sixteenth day of March, 1918, at half-past one o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
6. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
7. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools.
8. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for the tuition of pupils attending High Schools or Academies.
9. To see how much money the District will raise and appropriate for text-books and supplies for the ensuing year.
10. To see how much money the District will raise

and appropriate for the repair of school houses for the ensuing year.

11. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer or Officers and District Clerk and all other District Officers.

12. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to contract with the Nashua High School, or some other equal grade, to furnish instruction to its scholars for the ensuing year.

13. To see how much money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for its seventh and eighth grade school.

14. To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to unite with one or more town districts or special districts, to form a supervisory district, for the purpose of employing a superintendent of the public schools therein, under the provisions of Chapter 77 of the Session Laws of New Hampshire, 1899, and to raise money to carry such vote into effect.

15. To see if the District will vote to build a school house at Pelham Center, and furnish suitable grounds for its higher grades, or for a central school for the entire District, and if voted in the affirmative, appoint committees to raise and appropriate money to carry the same into effect.

16. To see if the District will adopt the plan recommended by the Department of Public Instruction, of renovating one school house per year, and if voted in the affirmative, to raise and appropriate money therefor.

17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
