## Town Warrant

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pelham, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pelham on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise, appropriate and set apart the amount of money necessary to secure State aid for the permanent improvement of highways under the law passed January session 1905.
4. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same, and determine in what manner the same shall be expended.
5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the extermination of moths and beetles.
6. To choose two persons for three years for Trustees of Cemeteries.

7. To choose one person for three years for Trustee of Public Library.

8. To choose one person for three years for Trustee of the Trust Funds of the Town.

9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise, in addition to the amount required by law, for the Public Library.

10. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.

11. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for cemeteries for the ensuing year.

12. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when they make their annual appraisal in April.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase one or more road scrapers, and if voted in the affirmative to take any action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on 1920 taxes paid before Sept. 1, 1920.

15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

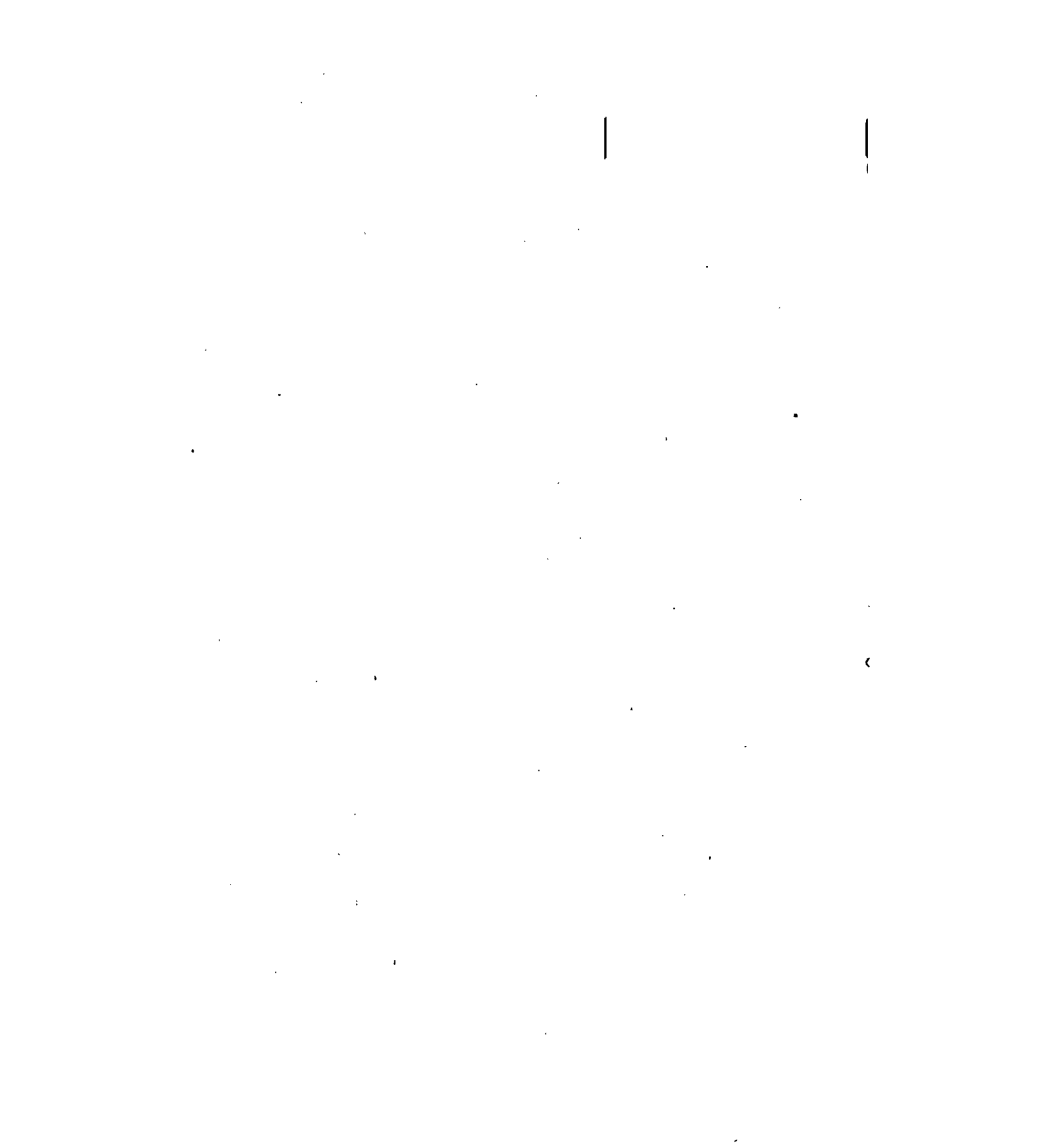

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## TRUSTEES' REPORT

The trustees would respectfully urge that the town recognize the fact that in the general increase of prices, books have probably increased in a greater degree than most other of life's necessities and with that knowledge, should be willing to increase the annual appropriation for their library that it may maintain the high standard of excellence for which it has always been noted. In an endeavor to extend the purchasing power of our funds we have bought the past year a selection of books made by our librarian from a circulating library that was closing out. This, however, is doubtful policy, both from the fact of the partially worn condition of the books, also because in an intelligent well posted community like ours the demand is for the latest and most up to date issues.

We believe, further, that a reasonable amount in addition to the regular appropriation for the subscription to a few standard magazines and periodicals to be placed on the reading tables in the Memorial room and the continuance of the movement inaugurated by the Civic League of having this room open one or two evenings a week under competent volunteer supervision would be a step in the right direction. The gift of a subscription to any suitable periodical from any one so inclined would be a grand investment, we believe, for public benefit, especially for our young people.

## School Board Report

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To the Citizens of the Pelham School District:

The District is confronted at this time with the problem of electing an entire new School Board and under the present conditions the situation should require the most careful consideration by each individual interested and this should mean every one entitled to a vote in the district.

This condition arises from the much regretted resignation of Mrs. Jack, the contemplated removal of Mr. McAlister from town and the expiration of the chairman's term of office. Under the above conditions the present board feel more free perhaps in the following brief report in making suggestions as follows:

The matter of the much discussed new building should be taken up at once and pushed so that it may be used the coming fall, in view of the threatened condemnation of the present graded school quarters by the state and in this connection would make the following recommendations. That as they will be charged with its use and care, the District should elect a committee in whom they have sufficient confidence to allow them to constitute the whole or a part of the construction committee; also notwithstanding the vote as it now stands for a three room building they would advise, as they did originally, a two room building with a basement, with provision for a stock room for the District, also manual training and domestic science, which are to be part of the state requirements.

The above would reduce the expense and we believe provide for some time for the needs of the district. In

view of the many calls upon them under the new law the compensation of the school board should be increased, although in the budget of estimates it is put in under the old figures, and perhaps the district may have those who have nothing else to do and of sufficient means to give their service which will obviate this.

A different method of compensation should be made for the Truant Officer, as with the existing conditions the salary paid is entirely inadequate, as in addition to the taking of the School Census, which when done under the present system is well worth the entire salary now paid, there must be prosecutions made to enforce the school attendance law and it is too much to expect that the expense and bother shall fall on the Truant Officer without pay therefor.

Our attendance and school work has been sadly hampered by the epidemic of the "Flu" in 1918 and again by the measles and diphtheria the past fall, but your committee have endeavored to keep the schools in session as continuously as possible and conform to the requirements of the Board of Health.

We are in receipt of a lengthy report embodying some recommendations from the District Supervisor. Mr. Record, which will be read at the annual meeting.

The following is a tabulated report of receipts and expenditures, attendance, etc., for the year 1918-1919.
