#### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Pelham in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said, Pelham, on Tuesday, March 9 next at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

The Polls open at 10 A.M. and close not earlier than 8 P.M.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing and as provided by Law.
- 2. To bring in your ballot on the following question; "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of Beano be declared no longer in effect in this Town."
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriation of the same. That is, if the Town will vote to accept the Town Budget as prepared by the Budget Committee and to take action thereon.
- 4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to act as its agent in any suit or suits which may arise during the current year, with authority to settle and adjust claims or demands for, or against the Town, and to employ counsel whenever in their judgement it is necessary, or act in relation thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when they make their appraisal in April.
- 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow necessary money in anticipation of taxes.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and make this act in effect until recinded, and make appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
- 8. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to paint, reshingle and refloor the hearse house in the Center Cemetery.
- 9. (By Petition): To see if the Town will vote to amend the Cemetery By-Laws so that they will read as follows-"Sale of grave lots to be not less than \$25.00 for six (6) grave lot and not more than \$50.00 for a twelve (12) grave lot for Towns people only. And \$75.00 for a six (6) grave lot and \$150.00 for a twelve (12) grave lot for Out Of Town People.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$568.17 as the Towns share of Town Road aid, the State to contribute \$3,787.78 as the States share, as provided by Law.
- 11. (By request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$150.00 (less than 1/100th of one percent of the Towns assessed valuation) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 communities in this Region, or act in relation thereto.
- 12. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the improvemnt and tarring or asphalt mix or other Black Top surface starting at the so called D. Simpson Road and continuing on Tallant Road Northerly to the Mammouth Road and to be done in the year 1954.

- 13. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to accept the McGrath Road as now used by the abuttors, from pole #33 at the Sherburne Road to premises now or formerly of Henry A. and Pauline A. McGrath, providing said McGraths or their grantees will bring said McGrath Road to a specified grade acceptable to the Selectmen of the Town.
- 14. (By Petition) If the Town votes to accept McGrath Road as set forth in a prior article, to see if the Town will vote to accept and improve Willis Road as now used by the abuttors, said road is shown as a "roadway" on plan #651 revised by plan #293 (3-22) at Hillsborough County Registry and horseshoe shaped begins at Medina land and runs to McGrath Road and bends back toward Long Pond to land of Bernier providing however that the said abuttors will bring said McGrath Road to a specified grade acceptable to the Selectmen of the Town.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Building Permit By-Laws, line five of said permit, the figure \$1,000.00 to be changed to \$3,500.00 so that it will read as follows-"No dwelling house less than \$3,500.00, exclusive of celar, shall be permitted."
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following amendment to the Building and Zoning By-Laws-"No building shall be built without a building permit and the approval of the Building and Zoning Board."
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following amendment to the Building and Zoning By-Laws, "The Selectmen will be authorized to issue building permits in the absence of the Building and Zoning Board."
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to change the term of office for the Highway Agent from one (1) year to three (3) years, beginning in the year 1955; or act in relation thereto.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote the following; "All bills due the Town will be itemized before payment is made by the Selectmen and Treasurer."
- 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Pelham for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1,55, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Trustees of Trust Funds.

#### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1952 - December 31, 1953: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1952 and December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein, the financial condition of the Town changed from a Net Debt of \$5,561.02 to a surplus of \$1,341.51, during the year 1953.

Analysis of change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)
An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 and A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$149.94, plus a net revenue surplus of \$2,773.17, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$2,923.11.

Summary of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1) A summary of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1953, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1953, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

#### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of record. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by compari-

son with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

The accounts and records of all town officials which we examined were found in good condition and the accounting procedure conformed to prescribed methods.

The provisions of Section 31, Chapter 211, of the Laws of 1939, require that this report or a summary of its esential features shall be published in the next annual town report.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Town of Pelham for their assistance during the course of the audit.







#### To the Pelham School Board:

I herewith submit my Fifth Annual Report.

It is a real source of satisfaction to be able to say that this past year has been marked by a very fine spirit of cooperation between the parents and teachers. This is particularly satisfying because one-half of the staff is new to our school. They should be complimented highly for the rapid adjustment they have made. A debt is owed to those other members of the staff who have done all they could to make this change over of teachers as smooth as possible. Pelham can well be pleased with the teachers now in its employ.

The problem of recruiting new teachers becomes increasingly more acute. Unless more is done to create more scholarships for pontential teachers we will soon find many classes without trained teachers. Young people are very reluctant to spend their time and money training for the teaching profession when the same time and money spent in other fields would qualify them for positions paying at least a thousand dollars a year more than in teaching.


The increasing school population throughout the whole country is presenting problems about which everyone should be made aware. Textbook companies and school supply houses were not able to keep ahead of the great demand created by this year's record first grade enrollment making supplies slow in coming through, and school furniture factories have just finished shipping back orders on desks and chairs.

In 1948 there were 172 pupils enrolled in the Pelham schools. This year there are 225 in the Pelham school. In 1949 there were 1,200 pupils in Supervisory Union #27 and this year there are over 2,00 pupils. Realizing that there now has

become so much detail work to be done that justice cannot be done to the supervision of instruction and at the same time help in providing supplies and classroom space. The State Department of Education recommended and the combined school boards of the Union voted to employ a "helping teacher" next year. This person will work in the entire area of instruction and should aid greatly in the continued improvement of educational opportunity for all the children of this area, which is the goal of all-school board members, teachers, parents and superintendent of schools.

During the month of February, we had quite a few cases of influenza, but otherwise we were extremely fortunate. This was the first year that we didn't have any any pediculosis head lice, and I hope that I can report this every year from now on.

In May, Mrs. Birshall and I applied the T. B. Patch Test to 78 children from the first, fifth and eighth grades and we had 2 reactors. These two were X-rayed and found free of T. B.

Our defective speech children attend a weekly speech class over in Hudson every Tuesday.

In June we had our "Get Acquainted Day" for the incoming first grade and 26 attended. We found 2 with vision defects that were attended to before school started in September.

Our lunch program is still going strong, and is well attended.

Every year is busier than the last, with new people and new problems, but I am confident with cooperation of all of us, no problem will be too large and I want to thank Mr. Hastings, the School Board, the Teachers, the P. T. A., the Parents and also the pupils for their cooperation.
